## The importance of the topic

# 1. Baptism is part of the **Great Commission**, the Church's 'marching orders'

Matthew 28v28: And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, <u>baptizing them</u> in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

- 2. Baptism is part of the inspiring summary of the first church, in Jerusalem

Acts 2v41: So those who received his word were <u>baptized</u>, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

## The importance of the topic

- 3. Baptism is on Paul's list of great uniting realities

Ephesians 4v4: There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call – <sup>5</sup> one Lord, one faith, one baptism, <sup>6</sup> one God and Father of all...

- 1. Gather 'ingredients' (Bible references)
- 2. Look at 'past recipes' (Historical summaries)
  - 1689 Baptist Confession of Faith
  - Benjamin Keach's catechism
- 3. 'Create your own...'

## 1. Baptism points to *Jesus*, his *death* and *resurrection*

### Gospel facts

Matthew 28v19: "Go and make disciples, baptizing them..."

Acts 2v38: "Repent and be baptized...in the name of Jesus Christ..."

Romans 6v3: "...of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death..."

Acts 2v23: "...this Jesus... you crucified... 24 God raised him up..."

**Romans 6v9**: ...Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again... <sup>10</sup> For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God..."

# 2. Baptism expresses *repentance*, *faith* and *submission*

#### Gospel requirements

- "I need to be made clean" (Acts 2v36-38, Psalm 51v2)
  Acts 22v16: "And now why do you wait? Rise and be baptized and wash away your sins, calling on his name."
- "I'm trusting Jesus and his saving work" identifying Romans 6
- "I belong to a new master"

Matt.28v20: a life of learning to obey

- 1. Baptism points to *Jesus*, his *death* and *resurrection*
- 2. Baptism expresses *repentance*, *faith* and *submission*
- 3. Baptism looks to God for *forgiveness*, *new life*, *eternal life*!

## Baptism looks to God for *forgiveness*, new life, eternal life!

#### Gospel promises

- Forgiveness of sins (Acts 2v38) (all I contribute is the dirt!)
- New life now, a break with the old (Rom.6; Mt.28v20), 2Cor.5v17 ...by the outpoured Holy Spirit (Acts 2v38)
- Future Resurrection! Rom.6v5 ("if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.")
- Already true (from the moment of penitent, saving faith), yet seeking more of God, and of the Spirit's transformation

## Baptism joins you, publicly, to God's people

### **Initiation**

- Acts 2v41: ...those who received his word were <u>baptized</u>, and there were <u>added</u> that day about three thousand souls.
- **1Corinthians 12v13**: For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body Jews or Greeks, slaves or free and all were made to drink of one Spirit.
- "Baptism doesn't make you a Christian..."
